She also was a tax consultant in Virginia and an administrator of the Hutchinson Medical Center, Hutchinson, MN. In her retirement Brenda enjoyed 7 years in Arizona before returning to Minnesota to make her home in Cold Spring. While in Cold Spring she became involved with various organizations in the St. Boniface Parish as well as the community. She was a member of St. Boniface Parish and an Oblate of St. Benedict's Monastery of

St. Joseph.
