In the 1980’s Lou formed a friendship with Orlo Steele. They enjoyed hunting and fishing together for many years, and eventually built a house in Cold Spring. In 2004 Orlo died. Lou enjoyed spending time with her family and friends. She was never without a smile and “conversation” should have been her middle name. Those whose life she touched, will always cherish her memory. She was a member of St. Boniface Parish, Catholic Aid Association and former member of St. Wendelin’s Parish in Luxemburg.
